Sawaya of the Fifth District Court of Appeal be retained in office? <input type="radio"/> YES <input type="radio"/> NO</p>	<p align="center">NO. 2 CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT ARTICLE I, NEW SECTION Florida Marriage Protection Amendment</p> <p>This amendment protects marriage as the legal union of only one man and one woman as husband and wife and provides that no other legal union that is treated as marriage or the substantial equivalent thereof shall be valid or recognized.</p> <p>The direct financial impact this amendment will have on state and local government revenues and expenditures cannot be determined, but is expected to be minor.</p> <p><input type="radio"/> YES <input type="radio"/> NO</p> <p align="center">NO. 3 CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT ARTICLE VII, SECTIONS 3 AND 4; ARTICLE XII, NEW SECTION Changes and Improvements Not Affecting the Assessed Value of Residential Real Property</p> <p>Authorizes the Legislature, by general law, to prohibit consideration of changes or improvements to residential real property which increase resistance to wind damage and installation of renewable energy source devices as factors in assessing the property's value for ad valorem taxation purposes. Requires Legislature to provide for classification and assessment of land used for conservation purposes, and not perpetually encumbered, solely on the basis of character or use. Subjects assessment benefit to conditions, limitations, and reasonable definitions established by general law. <p align="center">NO. 6 CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT ARTICLE VII, SECTION 4; ARTICLE XII, NEW SECTION</p> <p align="center">Assessment of Working Waterfront Property Based Upon Current Use</p> <p>Provides for assessment based upon use of land used predominantly for commercial fishing purposes; land used for vessel launches into waters that are navigable and accessible to the public; marinas and drystacks that are open to the public; and water-dependent marine manufacturing facilities, commercial fishing facilities, and marine vessel construction and repair facilities and their support activities, subject to conditions, limitations, and reasonable definitions specified by general law.</p> <p><input type="radio"/> YES <input type="radio"/> NO</p>	<p align="center">COCOA BEACH CITY CHARTER AMENDMENT #3</p> <p align="center">Departments of the City</p> <p>A Charter amendment is proposed, which will remove references to specific city departments and allow the City Commission to establish, subdivide, consolidate, rename or abolish departments of the City by a majority vote, rather than by unanimous vote.</p> <p>Should the above-described Charter amendment be adopted?</p> <p><input type="radio"/> YES, FOR AMENDMENT <input type="radio"/> NO, AGAINST AMENDMENT</p>
