**Referendum 3. Amending City Charter to Amend Council/Mayor Vacancies**

Shall Satellite Beach amend its charter to (a) allow councilmembers to appoint a replacement to fill a council or mayor vacancy until the next regular election, (b) eliminate special elections to fill single vacancies, and (c) establish procedures for filling three or more concurrent vacancies?

**Referendum 2. Amending City Charter to Amend Council/Mayor Terms and Length of Service**
