Referendum 1: Requiring Approval of Affected Property Owners for Certain Special Assessment Projects

Shall Section 6.02 of the City of Palm Bay charter be amended to require that before the governing body for the City may levy any special assessment involving more than fifty (50) property owners or involving a project expenditure of greater than twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000), the proposed amendment must first be approved, in writing, by a majority vote of the affected property owners who return a ballot?

Referendum 2: Relating to Petition Gathering and Signature Verification for Proposed Citizen Initiatives

Shall Section 3.09 of the city charter be amended to require that ordinances and charter amendments proposed by petition not be inconsistent with State law, require the use of a standardized petition form for signature gathering, require that petition signatures be verified by a city-designated official in accordance with the procedures governing signature verification set forth in Section 99.097, Florida Statutes, and clarify that petition sponsors are responsible for fees associated with signature verification?

Referendum 3: Governing Signature Requirements for Ordinances Proposed by Petition and Timing of Referendums

Shall Section 3.09 of the city charter be amended to reduce the percentage of electors required to sign a petition proposing an ordinance from 10 percent to 5 percent and require a referendum on a petition to amend the city charter or propose an ordinance be held at the next regular municipal election occurring more than 90 days after the city council certifies the petition or at a special election called by the city council?
